

Cable Lock

A cable lock is a simple yet effective tool to prevent unauthorized access to your firearm. Compatible with most firearm types, it can be installed in just a few easy steps. Below, you'll find general instructions for using your cable lock, along with specialized instructions for different firearm models.

General Cable Lock Instructions

- 1. **Unload the Firearm:** Before installing the cable lock, ensure your firearm is unloaded. Follow the appropriate steps based on your firearm type.
- 2. **Insert the Cable:** For each firearm type, follow the specific instructions to insert the cable into the designated area of the firearm.
- 3. Lock the Cable: Once the cable is inserted, use the key to lock the cable in place, securing the firearm.
- Store the Key Safely: After securing the firearm, place the key in a safe, secure location that only authorized users can access.

Instructions for Specific Firearm Types

Automatic Handgun

- 1. Remove the magazine.
- 2. Clear the chamber of any rounds.
- 3. Lock the slide in the back position per your firearm instruction manual.
- 4. Insert the cable through the ejection port and out through the magazine well.
- 5. Insert the key and lock the cable in place.
- 6. Store the key in a secure location.

Steps for Revolvers

- 1. Open the cylinder and unload all rounds.
- 2. Insert the cable through the barrel or any empty cylinder.
- 3. Insert the key and lock the firearm.
- 4. Store the key in a secure location.

Shotguns

- 1. Unload all shells from the chamber.
- 2. Lock the bolt in the open position, following your firearm's manual.

- 3. Insert the cable lock through the ejection port and out the unloading port.
- 4. Insert the key and lock the firearm.
- 5. Store the key in a secure location.

Steps for Bolt Action Rifles

- 1. Remove the magazine.
- 2. Open the action and clear the chamber of any rounds.
- 3. Lock the action in the open position (if applicable).
- 4. Insert the cable lock through the ejection port and out the magazine well.
- 5. Insert the key and lock the firearm.
- 6. Store the key in a secure location.

Additional Cable Lock Guidance

Key Warning: Ensure you keep your key in a safe, secure location at all times.

Troubleshooting: If the cable lock does not engage or secure the firearm, ensure that the cable is properly inserted through the designated ports and the lock is properly latched.

Important Safety Note: Always ensure that your firearm is fully unloaded before installing or removing any type of lock. Proper firearm storage, along with the use of safety locks, is a critical measure in preventing unauthorized use and accidents.
